

Explanations of the Smart City Wheel graph

A Smart City focuses on people in urban space and deals with a wide variety of topics, which are divided into six fields of action. These categories have further detailed levels of action. They are framed by needs-based actions and services („Actions“) in Swiss cities.

The six fields of action of the Smart City Wheel are:

Smart Mobility encompasses all facets of autonomous vehicles, bike sharing, multimodal transport chains and completely new logistics concepts (Cargo Sous Terrain).

Smart Living describes the personal living space that is designed smarter, e.g. to give people more self-determination and security.

Smart Economy stands, among other things, for new forms of work with networking of the actors. Co-Working jobs are just as important as open innovation and new forms of agile cooperation.

Smart Environment describes the intelligent handling of our environment, from buildings and green spaces to urban planning, which identifies problems as early as possible and makes locations more attractive.

Smart Governance describes the application of public sector technologies, such as the interaction between residents and the administration, as well as within the administration.

Smart People is the epitome of a population that is involved in decisions and projects. The higher the participation of the population, the more inhabitant friendly a city can become. It also stands, for example, for an infrastructure suitable for the disabled, equal opportunities or information services for the blind.
